




Duty

Humility

Unbiased

Hamilton became the Secretary of Treasury and Jefferson the Secretary of State. They ended up hating each other in their fight to influence Washington but he kept them both around to be unbiased. Jefferson decided to secret write insulting articles against Washington anyway.



Sacrifice

Washington sometimes made unpopular decisions like avoiding the French Revolution, signing the Jay Treaty, and using military to stop the Whiskey Rebellion. However, he was not afraid to do what was unpopular if he thought it was the best decision for the country.
